Ranch Sorting is a western-style equestrian sport that evolved from the common ranch work of separating cattle into pens for branding, doctoring, or transport. Ranch Sorting is an event that pits a team of two riders on horseback against the clock. Teamwork is the key with both riders working in harmony to cut out the correct cattle and drive them to the pen while keeping the wrong numbered cattle back.

Ranch sorting is performed in two pens that are fifty to sixty feet in diameter, with a twelve foot opening between the pens. The pens are rounded. Both pens are the same size and sorting can take place from either pen to the other.

At the beginning, there are ten calves at the herd end of one of the pens with numbers on their sides for identification. The judge raises the flag and when the riders cross the gap between the two pens the clock starts and the competition begins. The team of two riders have to move the cattle one at a time from one pen to the other in numerical order, starting with a random number called by the announcer. The fastest time wins. If a calf gets from one pen to the other out of order, then the team is disqualified.
